Welcome to Wildlife Camp at WildCare! We are looking forward to learning about wildlife with your child and expanding their awareness of the natural wonders around us. Please take the time to read **all** of the following information.

### Camp Guidelines and Reminders:

- Please be prompt with your arrival and departure times. WildCare does not provide childcare before or after camp.
- Please be sure to check in with camp staff each day when dropping off your child. If your child is going to be late or absent, please call **and** text Casey Pearce, Camp Manager, before the start of camp at 216-352-1431. If you are unable to reach Casey, please call Eileen Jones 415-472-9394.
- Please keep your child home if they are showing any signs or symptoms of illness.
- Apply sunscreen before camp.
- Children should wear sturdy, comfortable tennis or hiking shoes and layered clothing, appropriate for the weather. All clothes should be appropriate for art and outdoor activities. If there is rain in the forecast, waterproof jackets are recommended. Please label all clothing items.
- Bring a labeled backpack or bag for sunscreen, snacks, lunch, and extra clothes.
- Bring a healthy snack and a hearty lunch that **does not include any nut products**.
- Lost and found: articles left after the weekly camp session will be held for 2 weeks only. After 2 weeks, items will be donated to a local organization.

### Code of conduct:

- WildCare campers and staff are expected to treat all people and animals with dignity and respect at all times.
- Children are expected to behave in a manner that allows for all campers to have fun. This includes following directions and actively participating.
- Please leave electronics at home. Cell phones must be turned off and stored in your child's backpack during camp hours.
- Any child that hits, kicks, runs away from the camp group, uses foul language, or otherwise disrupts camp in such a manner that impedes the fun or safety of the other campers will be asked to leave.

## Health and Safety

We want every camper to have a fun and safe experience. Because this program is often outdoors, there are some hazards your child could encounter. Hazards include poison oak (long pants strongly recommended), mosquitos, bees, wasps, and ticks. **Please check your child thoroughly at the end of each excursion day for ticks.** If your child has an allergy, please be sure to include this information on their Emergency Form.

**Nut Free! Please leave all peanut and nut derived food items at home. While we are unable to completely eliminate the possibility that peanut or nut products may be present on site, we require our campers, staff, and volunteers to not include such products in their lunch and snack.**

**COVID-19:** In order to prioritize the health and safety of our campers and staff, we ask you **keep home a camper who is showing any signs or symptoms of any contagious illness.** Any participant may wear a mask if they choose but it is not required. If any concerning symptoms or positive COVID tests have been present in your household, please contact Camp Manager Casey Pearce at 216-352-1431.

### Directions to Dominican University's Angelico Hall | 20 Olive Ave., San Rafael, CA 94901 (drop off on Acacia Ave.)

**From the South:** Take the Central San Rafael exit from Highway 101, turn right on 2nd St, turn left on Grand Ave, follow directions below titled "Everyone"

**From the North:** Take the Central San Rafael exit from Highway 101, turn left on 2nd St, turn left on Grand Ave, follow directions below titled "Everyone"

**Everyone:** Continue on Grand Ave for 0.7 miles, turn right onto Acacia Ave, stay to the left and continue past Olive Ave, drop-off/pick-up will be on your right, on Acacia Ave.

**WildCare's Summer Wildlife Camp will be held at 20 Olive Avenue while WildCare's original site is under construction. Our live ambassador animals will come to visit camp so your camper won't miss out on their amazing wildlife experiences. We thank you for your understanding during this time of transition.**
