Read the paragraph below to learn about one of the animals WildCare will teach about during the visit, and then answer the questions with information you learned.

A baby deer is called a fawn! Fawns are born with white spots. The spots fade as they grow into adults. The fawn's white spots help them hide on the forest floor. This is called camouflage. The fawn is also born without a scent. With no scent, predators can't sniff them out while they are hiding. The fawns stay perfectly still while their mothers are away foraging for food. If you see a fawn curled up in the forest you should leave them alone. If you touch the fawn you will leave a scent on their fur. That scent can attract predators. Be a nature superhero and don't touch wild animals!

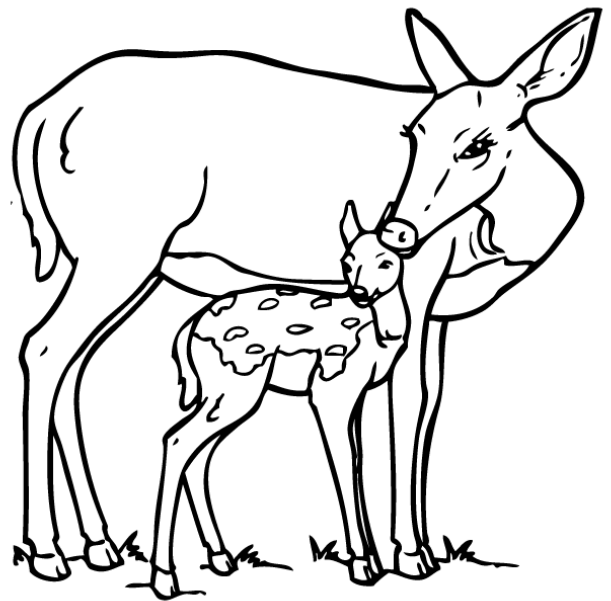
