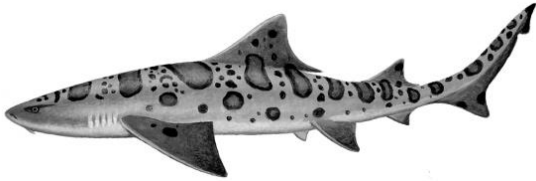
Who Eats Who?



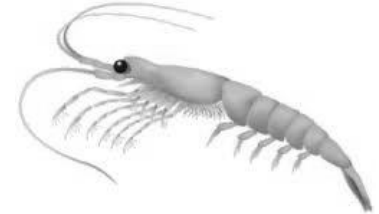
Many ocean animals can be both **predator** (*hunting for their food*) and **prey** (*being hunted as the food!*).

Then, underneath the animal, describe what **adaptation** (*specialized body part or behavior*) might help them to catch or eat that prey!



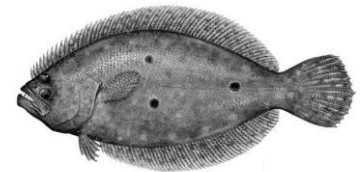
Leopard Shark

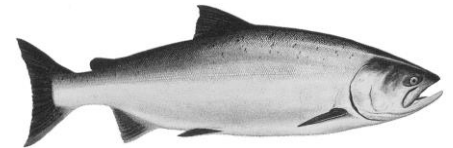

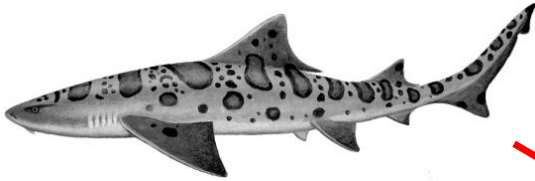
Who Eats Who?

Taking their stomach outside of their body.



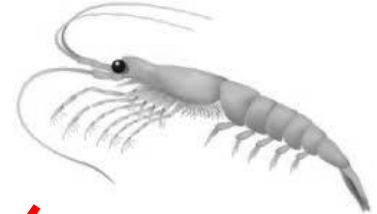
Gray Whale

Baleen for filtering out tiny animals from water.

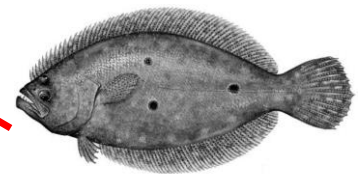


Brown Pelican

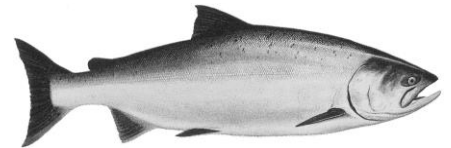
A large beak and neck pouch for scooping.
