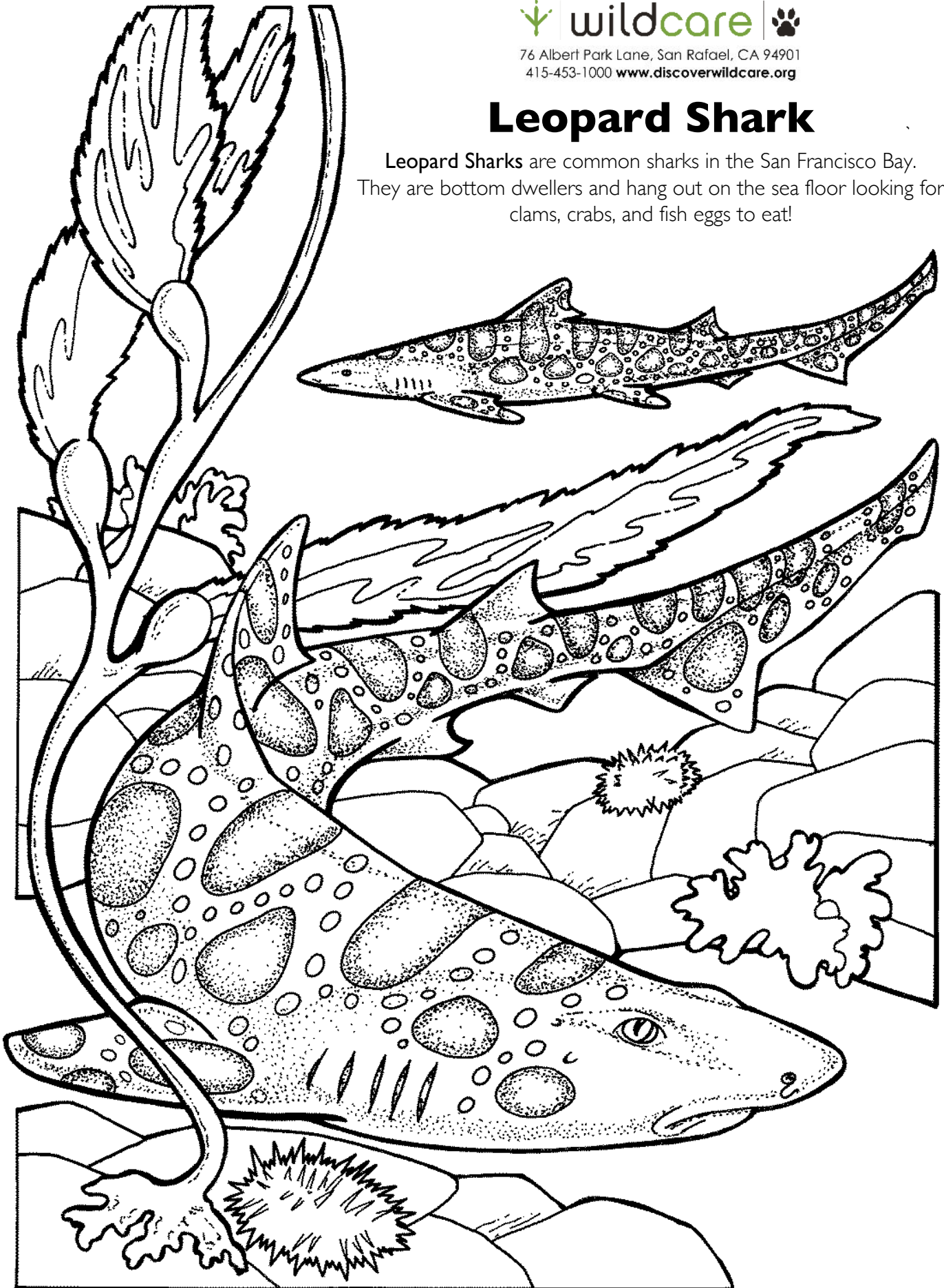
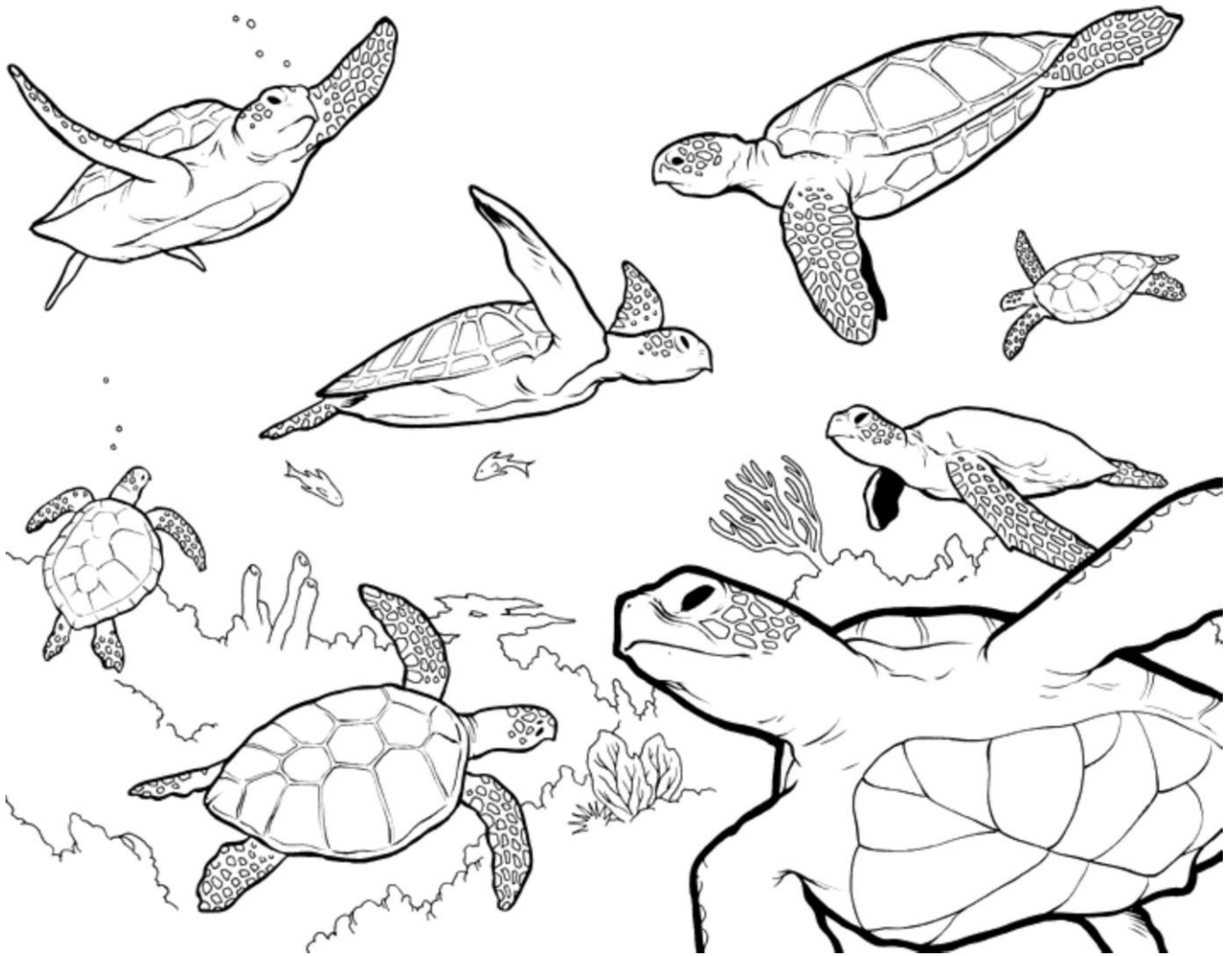


## Leopard Shark

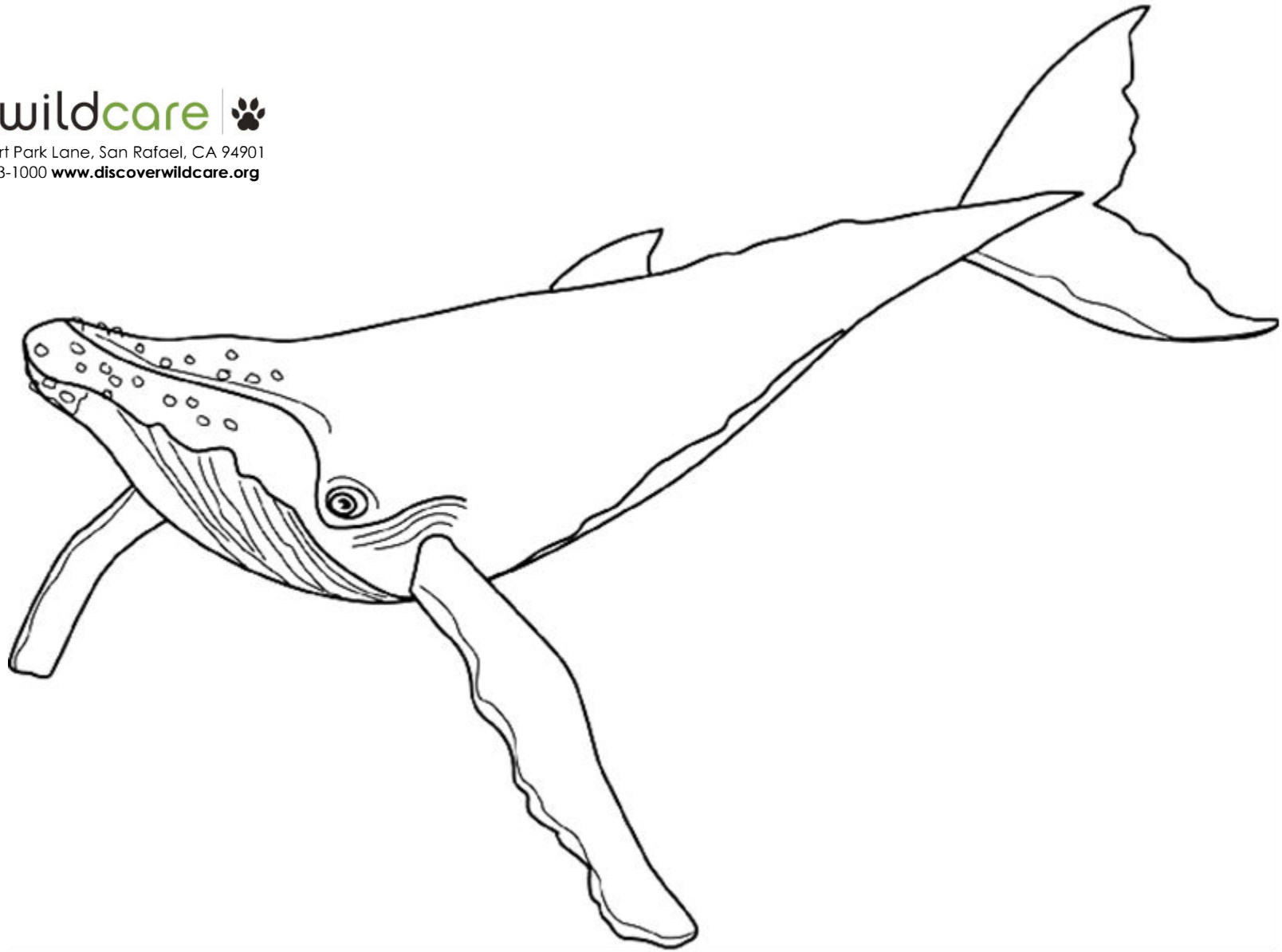
# Hawksbill Sea Turtle

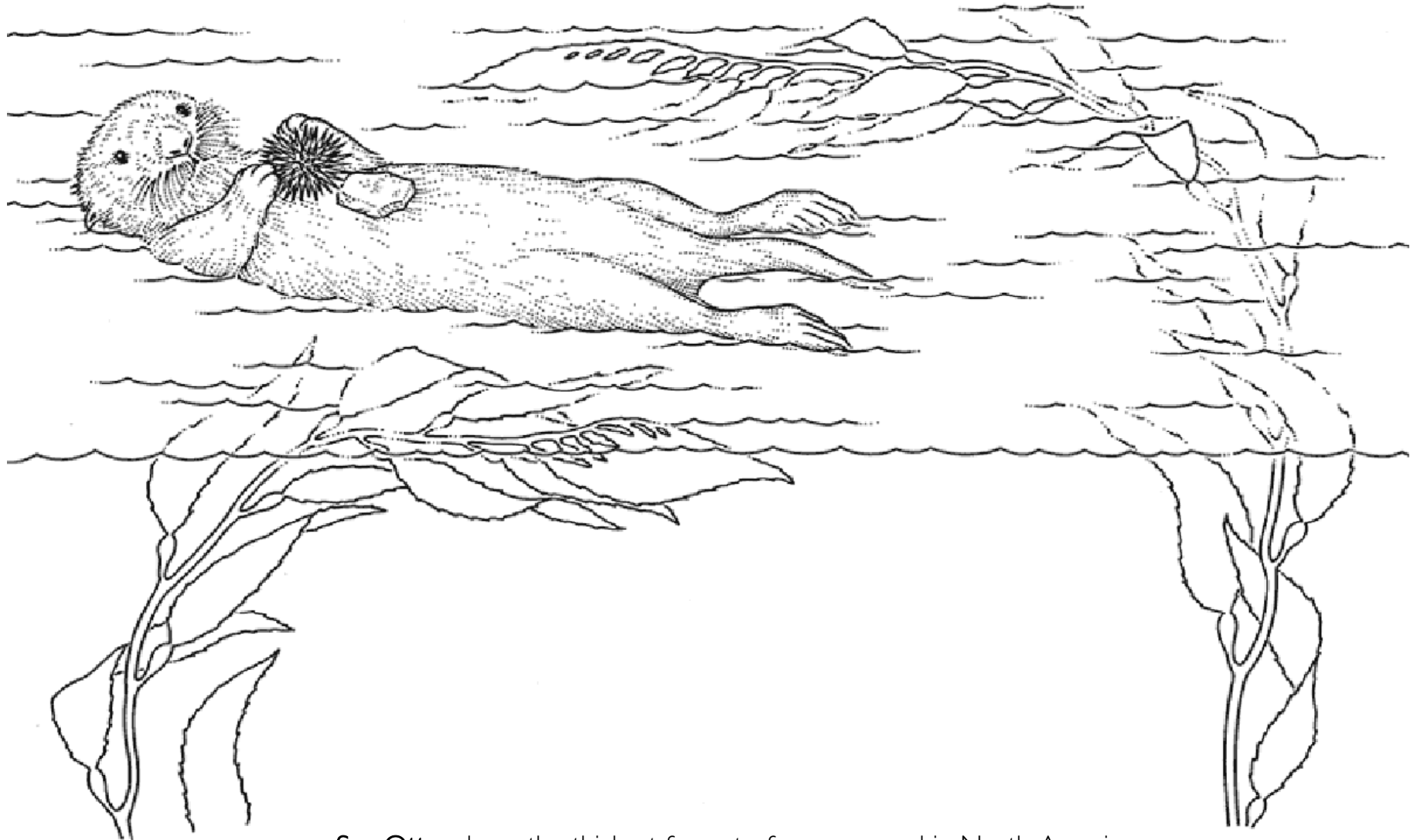
