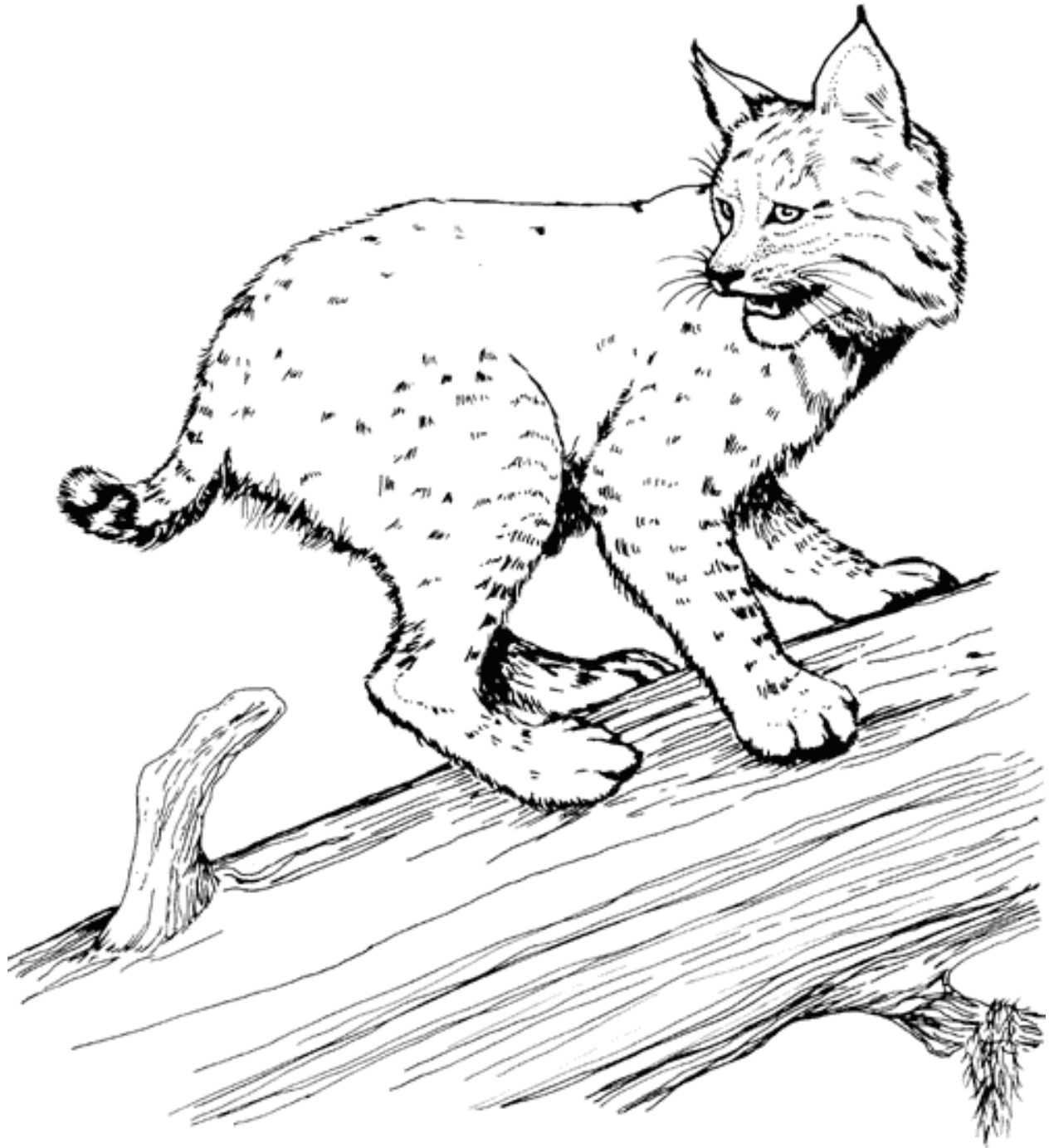


# Bobcat

# Raccoon

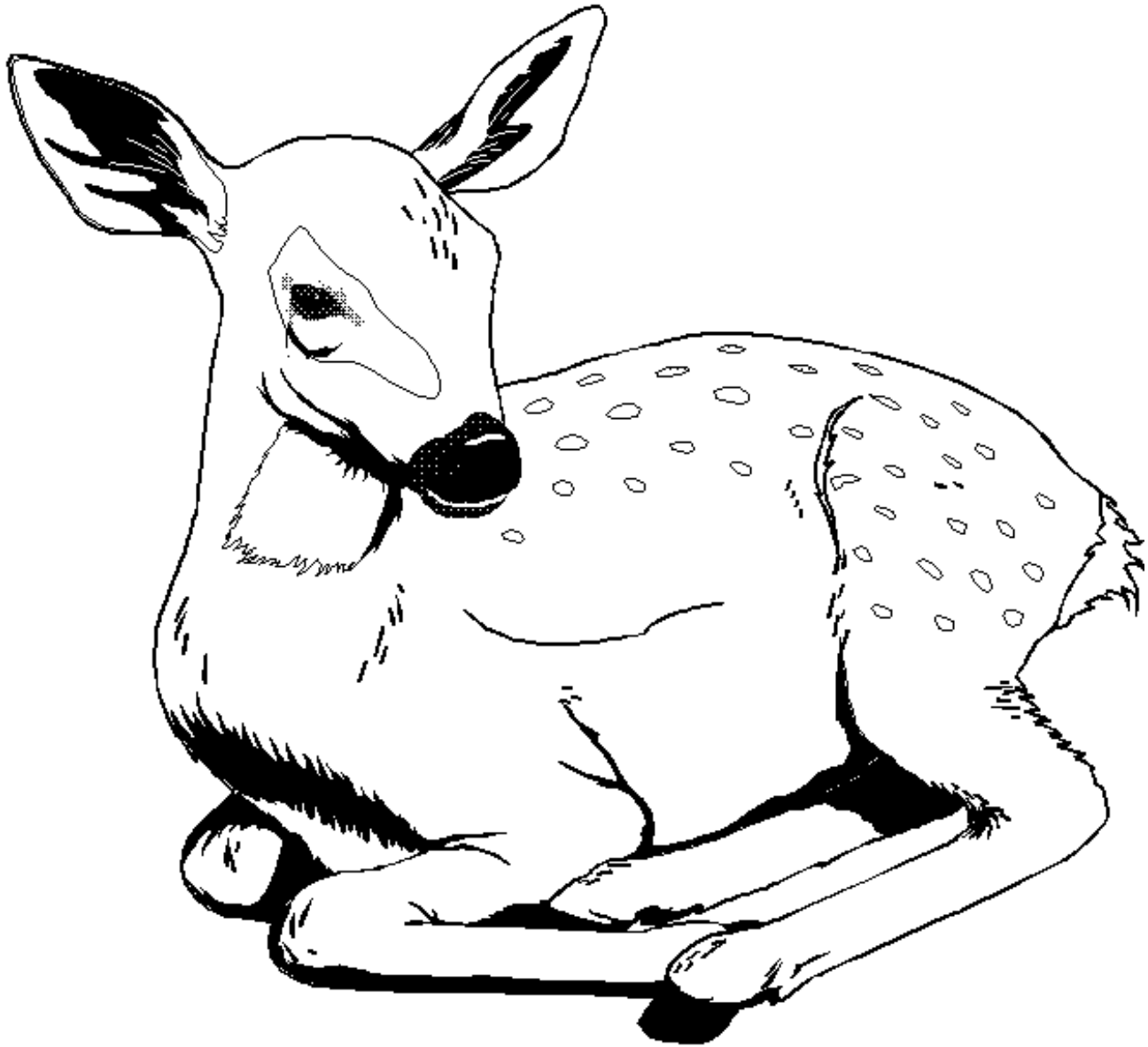

# Black-tailed Mule Deer

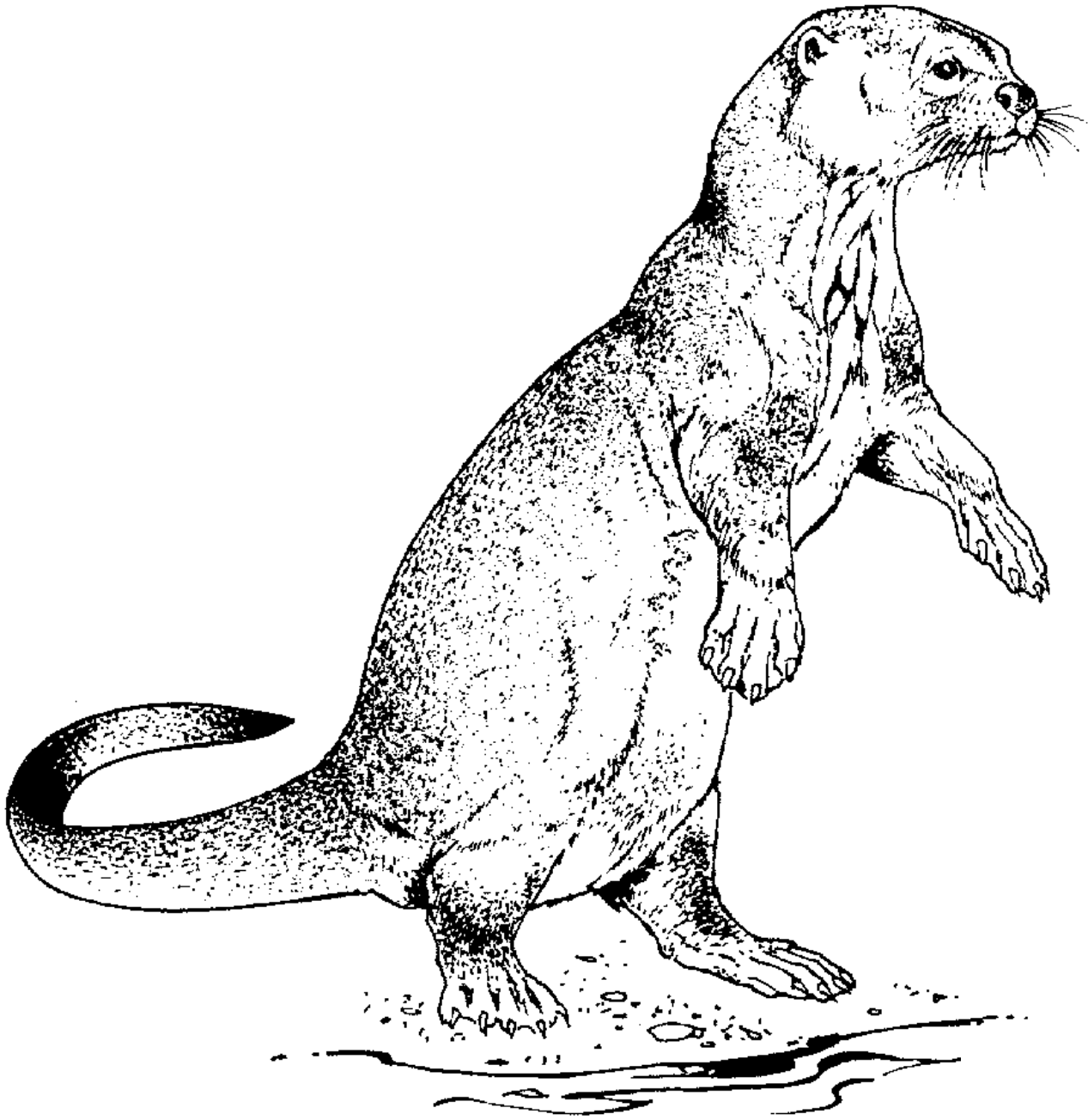


Black-tailed Mule Deer are brown with black on their tails.

# River Otter

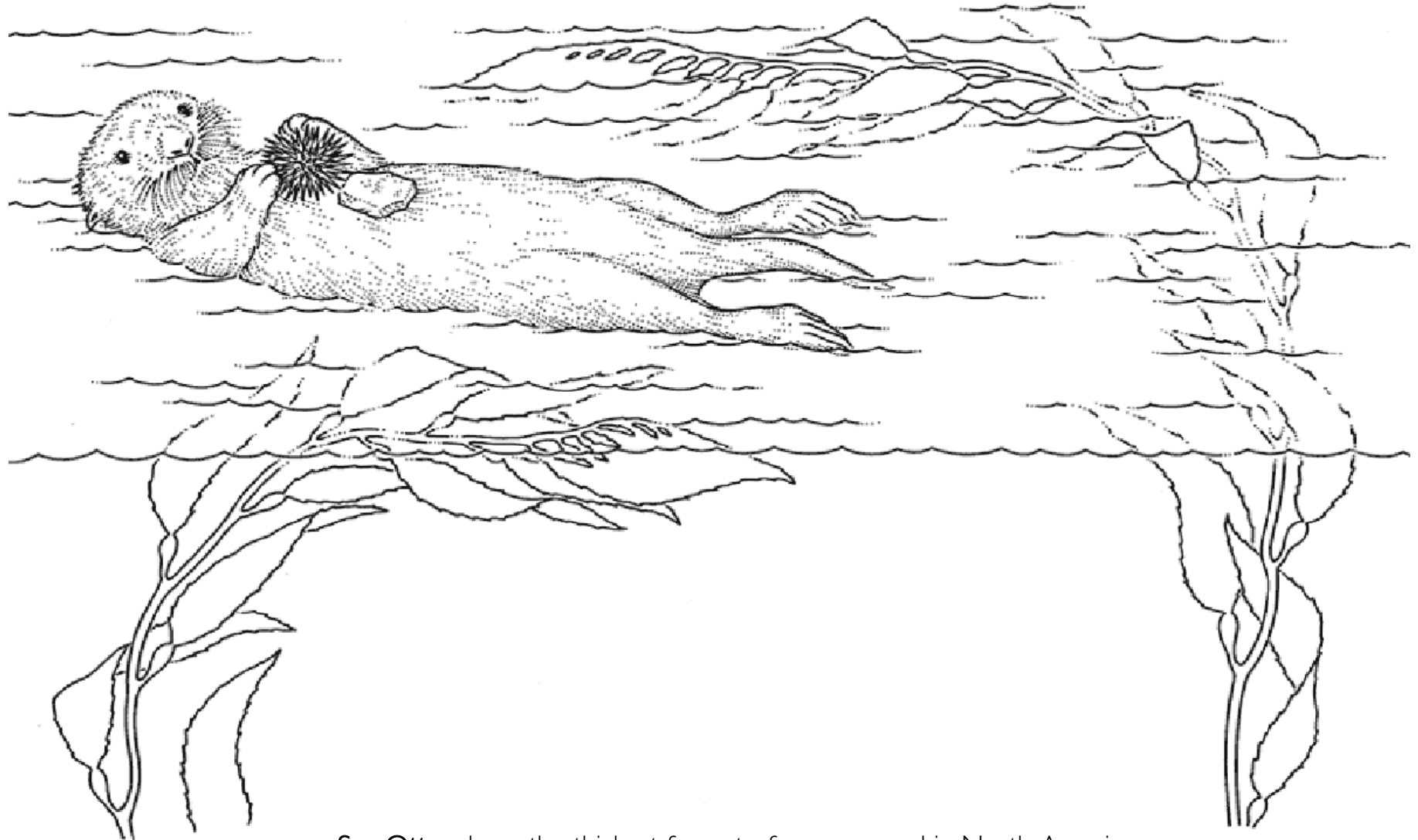


The River Otter chases fish underwater and rests on land inside a den.
